The tech industry bolsters Kansas' economy, with over an \$8 billion GDP output from the information technology sector.¹ An impressive nine percent of the state's workers are employed by the technology industry² and the state ranks 2nd in the nation for share of power produced by renewable energy technology.³ The Kansas City MO-KS metro area also ranks 14th in highest number of tech jobs per capita of any large metropolitan area.⁴
