The information technology sector contributes nearly \$4 billion to New Hampshire's GDP.¹ The Granite State's tech sector is primed to continue growing based on its access to talent as 10.7% of New Hampshire's workforce is employed in the technology industry.² New Hampshire tech companies are generally smaller, with 60% reporting fewer than 50 employees, compared to 46% nationally.³ The sector is expected to grow an estimated 6% over the next five years.
